MAJOR CITIES TO BE VISITED

Volos

This city is situated between Athens and Thessaloniki combining magnificent sea and exciting mountains. It is the gateway to Mount Pelion and serves as the first step to the Sporades islands. A picturesque city with an ancient history it sits at the foot of exceptional mountain monasteries.

The Holy Meteora Monasteries

A few kilometres northwest of the town of Kalambaka lie the impressive monoliths of the Meteora. Rising from the plains of Thessaly they are one of the most astonishing sites in Greece. On these gigantic rocks, surrounded by a breath-taking landscape reaching heights of more than 600 meters, one of the most important monastic communities in Macedonia was formed. The word Meteora means “suspended in the air” and this aptly describes these remarkable monasteries. Today only six monasteries are active each with a small number of monks or nuns. In 1988, the Meteora were included in the UNESCO World Heritage List. Moreover, the area is part of the Natura 2000 Network, hosting a number of rare species of birds and flowers.

Thessaloniki

This is the second-largest city in Greece, with over 1 million inhabitants in its metropolitan area. It is Greece's second major economic, industrial, commercial and political centre and is a major transportation hub for Greece and southeastern Europe, notably through the Port of Thessaloniki.

The city of Thessaloniki was founded in 315 BC by Cassander of Macedon and was named after his wife Thessalonike, daughter of Philip II of Macedon and sister of Alexander the Great. An important metropolis by the Roman period, Thessaloniki was the second largest and wealthiest city of the Byzantine Empire. It was conquered by the Ottomans in 1430 and remained an important seaport and multi-ethnic metropolis during the nearly five centuries of Turkish rule. It passed from the Ottoman Empire to Greece on 8 November 1912.

Day 1 October - Saturday 23rd: Pick up from **Athens** and drive to Volos.

Day 9 October - Sunday 31st:

Transfer to **Thessaloniki** airport for the departure flight.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Travellers from the main bloc of countries allowed entry may skip quarantine, provided they have a negative **PCR test** within 72 hours before travel, proof of infection within the past 2-9 months, or proof they've been fully vaccinated, and completed their cycle at least 14 days earlier. Acceptable vaccines are Pfizer BioNtech, Moderna, AstraZeneca, Novavax, Johnson + Johnson, Sinovac, Sputnik, Cansino and Sinopharm. This is in deviation from official EU policy, which is to only admit those who have received EU-approved vaccines.

Negative PCR tests must have been taken within 72 hours of departure, must be written in English and include the name and passport number of the person traveling.

All travellers must complete a Passenger Locator Form (**PLF**) prior to departure. This includes details of where the individual has been and the address they plan to stay at in Greece. Each PLF includes a unique **QR code** which must be scanned upon arrival at the Greek border.

The **QR code** will tell you whether you need to have an additional test done at the airport. If you do, you must self-isolate until you have the results -- around 24 hours.

It is wise for all travellers to have taken the double injection. Also, it is recommended to take out **Covid Insurance** for the length of the pilgrimage.

Dress code for entry to churches and monasteries: women only to wear dresses/frocks; men should not wear shorts.
